Secondary Data Methodology and Scoring

Data scoring is done in three stages:



For each indicator, each county is assigned a score based on its comparison to other communities, whether health targets have been met, and the trend of the indicator value over time. These comparison scores range from 0-3, where 0 indicates the best outcome and 3 the worst. Availability of each type of comparison varies by indicator and is dependent upon the data source, comparability with data collected for other communities, and changes in methodology over time.

Indicators are categorized into topic areas and each topic area receives a score. Indicators may be categorized in more than one topic area. Topic scores are determined by the comparisons of all indicators within the topic.

Comparison to a Distribution of County Values: Within State and Nation

For ease of interpretation and analysis, indicator data is visually represented as a green-yellow-red gauge showing how the community is faring against a distribution of counties in the state or the United States. A distribution is created by taking all county values within the state or nation, ordering them from low to high, and dividing them into three groups (green, yellow, red) based on their order. Indicators with the poorest comparisons ("in the red") scored high, whereas indicators with good comparisons ("in the green") scored low.

Comparison to Values: State, National, and Targets

Each county is compared to the state value, the national value, and target values. Target values include the nation-wide Healthy People 2030 (HP2030) goals. Healthy People 2030 goals are national objectives for improving the health of the nation set by the Department of Health and Human Services' Healthy People Initiative. For all value comparisons, the scoring depends on whether the county value is better or worse than the comparison value, as well as how close the county value is to the target value.

Trend over Time

The Mann-Kendall statistical test for trend was used to assess whether the county value is increasing over time or decreasing over time, and whether the trend is statistically significant. The trend comparison uses the four most recent comparable values for the county, and statistical significance is determined at the 90% confidence level. For each indicator with values available for four time periods, scoring was determined by direction of the trend and statistical significance.

Missing Values

Indicator scores are calculated using the comparison scores, availability of which depends on the data source. If the comparison type is possible for an adequate proportion of indicators on the community dashboard, it will be included in the indicator score. After exclusion of comparison types with inadequate availability, all missing comparisons are substituted with a neutral score for the purposes of calculating the indicator's weighted average. When information is unknown due to lack of comparable data, the neutral value assumes that the missing comparison score is neither good nor bad.

Indicator Scoring

Indicator scores are calculated as a weighted average of all included comparison scores. If none of the included comparison types are possible for an indicator, no score is calculated, and the indicator is excluded from the data scoring results.

Topic Scoring

Indicator scores are averaged by topic area to calculate topic scores. Each indicator may be included in up to three topic areas if appropriate. Resulting scores range from 0-3, where a higher score indicates a greater level of need as evidenced by the data. A topic score is only calculated if it includes at least three indicators.

Appendix G. Secondary Data Sources for Health and Geographic Disparities

Disparities and Health Equity

Identifying disparities by population groups and geography helps to inform and focus priorities and strategies. Understanding disparities also helps us better understand root causes that impact health in a community and inform action towards health equity.

Health Equity

Health equity focuses on the fair distribution of health determinants, outcomes, and resources across communities.¹ National trends have shown that systemic racism, poverty, and gender discrimination have led to poorer health outcomes for groups such as Black/African American persons, Hispanic/Latino persons, indigenous communities, people with incomes below the federal poverty level, and LGBTQ+ communities.

Community health disparities were assessed in the secondary data using the Index of Disparity² analysis, which identifies disparities based on how far each subgroup is from the overall county value. For more detailed methodology related to the Index of Disparity, see Appendix A.

Table 12 identifies secondary data indicators with a statistically significant race, ethnicity, or gender disparity for Memorial Herman Health System, based on the Index of Disparity.

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The Index of Disparity analysis for the Memorial Hermann Health System service area shows that certain population groups are more affected by specific health and socioeconomic indicators. Black/African American populations are more likely to experience higher Age-Adjusted Death Rates related to diabetes, stroke, coronary heart disease, and various cancers, including breast, prostate, and colorectal cancer. They are also more impacted by higher rates of Premature Death and lower Life Expectancy. Hispanic/Latino and Other Race groups show disparities in indicators such as health insurance coverage, poverty, and educational attainment. Males are more affected by several cancer incidence and mortality rates, as well as unintentional injury deaths. Age-related disparities are also present, with younger adults (ages 19–34) and older adults (65+) experiencing gaps in educational attainment, poverty levels, and health insurance coverage. These findings suggest that certain groups may benefit from more focused outreach and support efforts to help reduce disparities and improve overall health outcomes.

Geographic Disparities

Geographic disparities were identified using the Health Equity Index, Food Insecurity Index, and Mental Health Index. Index, Food Insecurity Index, and Mental Health Index. These indices have been developed by Conduent Healthy Communities Institute to easily identify areas of high socioeconomic need, food insecurity, or areas with poorer mental health outcomes. For all indices, counties, zip codes, and census tracts with a population over 300 are assigned index values ranging from 0 to 100, with higher values indicating greater need. Understanding where there are communities with higher need is critical to targeting prevention and outreach activities. This assessment identified specific zip codes with differences in outcomes related to health and non-medical drivers of health.

SocioNeeds Index

The SocioNeeds Index Suite provides analytics around non-medical drivers of health to advance equitable outcomes. Created by Conduent Healthy Communities Institute, each index summarizes multiple health and socioeconomic indicators into one validated composite score to help identify areas for action.

The SocioNeeds Index Suite can help:

- Justify and validate investments for prevention and early intervention.
- Clearly communicate areas for shared action by healthcare, public health, social services, community organizations, business, and others
- Inform policies and interventions at the regional level.

Health Equity Index

Conduent's Health Equity Index (HEI) uses socioeconomic data to estimate which zip codes are at greatest risk for poor health outcomes, such as preventable hospitalization or premature death. Each zip code is ranked based on its index value to identify relative levels of need. Table 13 provides the index values and local ranking for each zip code. The map in Figure 18 illustrates that the zip codes with the highest level of socioeconomic need (as indicated by the darkest shade of blue) are zip codes 77033 and 77029, each with an index value of 99.4 and 99.3 respectively.

Conduent's Food Insecurity Index estimates areas of low food accessibility correlated with social and economic hardship. Zip codes are ranked based on their index value to identify relative levels of need. Table 14 provides the index values for each zip code. The map in Figure 19 illustrates the zip code with the highest level of food insecurity (as indicated by the darkest shades of green) is zip code 77032 and 77028 with an index value of 99.7 and 99.5 respectively.

Appendix J. Evaluation of Progress Since Previous CHNA

From 2022 to 2024, MHHS focused on four key priority areas: Access to Health Care, Emotional Well-Being, Food as Health, and Exercise is Medicine. Significant strides were made across all areas through system-wide and community-based initiatives.

Priority Health Need #1: Access to Health Care

MHHS supports efforts that improve access to care by ensuring patients receive the right care, at the right place, time, and cost. Key initiatives include system-wide programs like Nurse Healthline – a free, 24/7 service offering guidance on care needs and referrals –and ER Navigation, which helps uninsured, and Medicaid patients shift from avoidable ER visits to medical homes. Community hospitals also contribute through targeted interventions tailored to local needs.

- Nurse Healthline supported access to care in Greater Houston, averaging 30,000 calls annually during the latest CHNA cycle.
- During the latest CHNA cycle, the Woodlands campus issued nearly 1,000 taxi and Lyft vouchers to help patients without transportation return home after care.
- The Southwest campus assisted over 2,900 uninsured and underinsured individuals with healthcare education and eligibility applications through the Community Resource Center
- Through Project Mammogram the Northeast campus provided over 560 free mammograms to support early cancer detection and resource access.

Priority Health Need #2: Emotional Well-Being

MHHS' system-wide initiative supports community members facing mental health crisis by providing timely access to psychiatric care, redirecting ER visits to Mental Health Crisis Clinics, connecting individuals to long-term providers through the Integrated Care Program, and offering navigation support regardless of ability to pay via Psychiatric Response Case Management.

- During the latest CHNA cycle, the Mental Health Crisis Clinics served over 2,500 patients annually across the system.
- During the latest CHNA cycle, the Integrated Care Program served over 52,000 patients across the system with more than 15,000 patients annually screened for depression.
- Over 50 support groups were offered annually during the CHNA cycle, including Cancer Support, and Modern Widows Club.

Priority Health Need #3: Food as Health

MHHS addressed food insecurity by screening patients in the ER and care settings, then connecting them to the Houston Food Bank for SNAP and pantry support as well as referring to in-house food support resources. The system also promotes nutrition education to help prevent chronic disease

- Diabetes education efforts reached over 1,100 community members, annually, during the latest CHNA cycle, increasing awareness and access to management resources.
- During the latest CHNA cycle, the Southwest Campus launched a Food Market to address food insecurity and support diabetes care. Since launch, over 115 patients have enrolled in the FoodRx program, integrating food access, nutrition education and clinical care.

Priority Health Need #4: Exercise is Medicine

MHHS promotes physical activity to support better health, social connection and emotional well-being.

- Over 70 monthly fitness classes such as walking groups, Zumba and Tai-Chi—were offered across campuses.
- Health Centers for Schools also provided 18,000+ student physicals and supported 60+ community events during the latest CHNA cycle.
